The last few weeks have not been our usual lovely spring weather. Mother nature turned it around in time for June and for that I am quite grateful. There are good things happening before the summer begins.

The Community Garden is starting to shape up and it is nice to see Residents getting their beds ready for the growing season. We are collaborating again with River Friends to hold a nature camp for elementary age kids in the Park for 2 weeks. People may register their child(ren) for one or both weeks and space is limited. This camp will be held the last 2 weeks in August. We will be extending the day slightly to allow the kids to swim before pick up. We have gotten great feedback on last year’s camp and I expect it will be even better this year. Many thanks go out to River Friends for running this camp and taking such great care to balance learning with having fun. Also, Residents will be able purchase season pool passes and register for swim lessons. Details are in this newsletter.

The Recreation Board is making plans to celebrate the completion of the new basketball courts. I had mentioned in the last newsletter that we would be shooting (pun intended) for late May to hold an event for Residents, to celebrate the result of a year-long collaboration to make new courts happen. The plan is to eliminate the old courts that are deteriorating and make it green space for the time being. This will be a project for the fall.





Tis the season for lawn mowing

Did you know there's one thing you may be doing while mowing the yard that's actually illegal in New York State?

As mowers are being brought out of winter storage, you need to keep this in mind to avoid a fine.

Blowing your grass clipping in the road is against the law in New York. You may not only be fined but you could also get sued if the clippings cause an accident.

Section 1219 of the [New York Vehicle and Traffic Law](#) prohibits grass clippings and other debris on streets and highways.

No person shall throw or deposit upon any highway any glass bottle, glass, nails, tacks, wire, cans, snow, **grass clippings** or any other substance likely to injure any person, animal, or vehicle upon such highway.

Grass clippings can reduce traction and cause a motorcycle driver to lose control.

If there's an accident, you're responsible.

ALSO be kind to the many walkers and keep the sidewalks clean



Lawn Care Tools and Hours of Operation

With the spring and summer months upon us, the West Elmira Police Department would like to remind residents and lawn care companies of the Town of Elmira Noise Ordinance.

Lawn care and gardening tools that are audible beyond the property line, are only permitted to be operated between the hours of 8 AM to 8 PM on weekdays and between 9 AM to 8 PM on weekends.

Violations of this ordinance can be reported by calling police dispatch at (607) 735-8600.
